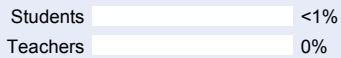

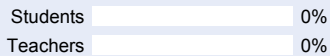

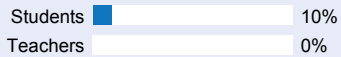

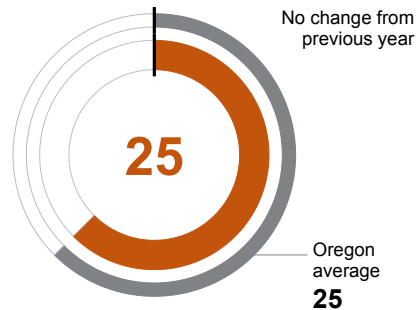

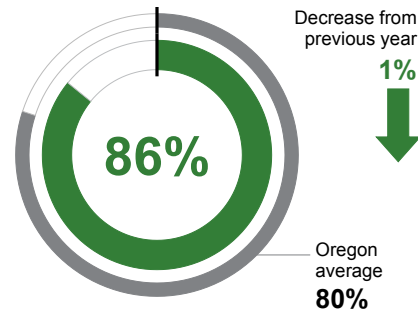
CLASS SIZE

REGULAR ATTENDERS

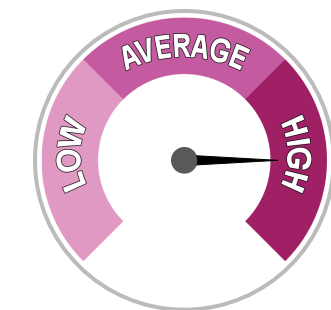
Students who attended more than 90% of their enrolled school days.

INDIVIDUAL STUDENT PROGRESS

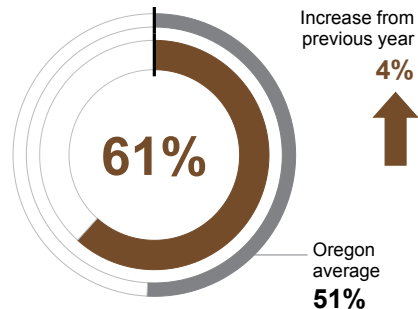
Year-to-year progress in English language arts and mathematics.

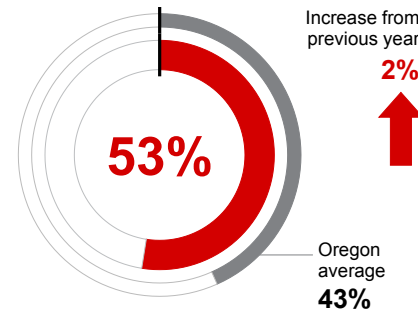
ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS

Students meeting state grade-level expectations.



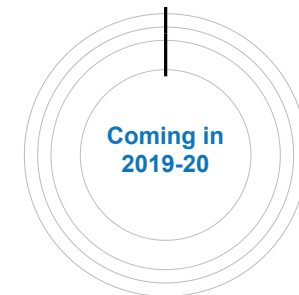
MATHEMATICS

School Goals

At Melrose school the "Roots run Deep". Utilizing transformational social-emotional learning strategies through our Conscious Discipline initiative, we will create healthy learning environments that foster a climate of safety, caring and respect, and have resulted in improved student academic outcomes.

State Goals

The Oregon Department of Education is partnering with school districts and local communities to ensure a 90% on-time, four year graduation rate by 2025. To progress toward this goal, the state will prioritize efforts to improve attendance, provide a well-rounded education, invest in implementing culturally responsive practices, and promote continuous improvement to close opportunity and achievement gaps for historically and currently underserved students.

Safe & Welcoming Environment

We believe that every child has a need to feel safe and connected. We believe that behavior is best remediated through a restorative approach that ensures that they have not only made amends for their behavior but have also learned new skills to be better next time. Our teachers start each day with a morning meeting and greeting. This makes time in our day for children to build relationships and connections that will serve them at school and throughout our community.

BULLYING, HARASSMENT, AND SAFETY POLICIES

Our school has a CDS (Child Development Specialist) who visits every classroom each week. She teaches lessons on socio-emotional needs, how to address bullying and harassment, conducting oneself with integrity and honesty, among many other topics. We have skills groups for students who are struggling (e.g., connecting with others appropriately, strategies for behaving appropriately on the bus, etc.), and we employ a number of strategies for connecting adults and students for positive reinforcement. Our campus has gone through some renovation to create a safer space and to ensure that all members of our community first connect with the office when they enter onto campus.
